Fast forward three years and life has changed a lot! This year, we enjoyed a fabulous Easter Day in church, we've - more or less learned to live with Covid and—for me at least—life has changed a huge amount.

Three years ago, I was finishing my 'Vicar School' degree, preparing to give up the job I'd held in Public Health for 18 years and getting ready to join the All Hallows family. Now, I'm almost at the end of my curacy and looking ahead to what's next

What's next (God and my counter-terrorism clearance willing!) is working as a prison chaplain, over in

Wigan. As a family, we'll be staying in Cheadle and the plan is that I'll be licensed as an Associate Minister here, so I can still help out whenever I'm not in jail!

Over the last 3 years, it's been great to worship and serve alongside you. Thank you especially for your support in opening our church as a Debt Centre—we've worked with over 70 individuals & families since November 2020 and I'm delighted that Rosemary will be carrying this on. Please keep praying for CAP and all those involved with it. Please also have a look at the charity Acts 435—it's a way of connecting people who want to give with people in real need.

At CAP, we often put requests on Acts 435 if someone needs money, e.g. for a new bed, or fridge, or to help towards their insolvency fees. It's a really simple and practical way of making a huge difference to someone's life.

So, looking back—thank you! Thank you for welcoming us in, for being salt & light in this part of Cheadle & bringing out the God-colours in the world. (Mt 5:14) And, looking forwards, as the other Paul said, keep going! May this always be true for us:

"I've got my eye on the goal, where God is beckoning us onward—to Jesus. I'm off and running, and I'm not turning back." Phil 3:14 The Message

## New or Visiting?

#### First Time Here?

If it's your first time here then welcome! It's great to have you with us. Here are a few short notes that you might find helpful.

**Relax -** You're our guest, so make yourself at home. If there is anything that you would like to know then ask one of the Welcome Team by the front door.

We don't expect guests to give - For those who are members or regular attenders there is an offering plate at the back, but we don't ask our guests for any money.

**We have a Loop System -** Switch your hearing aid to T-coil. You might find it useful to sit towards the middle.

**Hang around afterwards** - Come and join us for a cup of tea or fresh coffee, and for a chat—drinks are served in the hall and we usually gather in the lounge to chat.

**Prayer** - If you would like someone to pray with you — either prayer for you or for someone you know — there are people who would love to do so after the service. Please make yourself known to the service leader.

Children & Youth - Once a month, the whole church worships together. On other weeks, there is a Sunday School for primary aged children and a group for high-school age young people. One of the Welcome Team can show you where these groups meet. For pre-school age children, there are green tables at the side of church with activities. Please don't be embarrassed if your children make any noise—they are welcome here and are part of the service, too! All our children and youth leaders have DBS checks and have undergone safeguarding training.
