We are going to start this by intensifying our praying. There is no point in us doing anything for the Lord unless we are following his lead and his hand is in what we are doing. So, we are going to be praying more.

We are going to do more to make contact with people from our community. Whether that be through pressing on with the great things that we are already doing, or whether it is something new. We want to show people the love of Jesus and explain it to them too.

We are going to be creating more opportunities for us to invite people to things at church. That might be some of the different activities that we hold, or it might be church services. In June and July we are going to be having a 6 week series Visitor of Services, where will we restructure our Sunday morning services a little, to give them more of a focus for those who don't usually go to church anywhere.



As we do these things we want to be honest and up front about who we are and why we do these things. We love God and we love our neighbour as ourselves. We live as we do because we want to serve God and we want to serve the people of our wider community.

The whole world is going through this unsettling time of transition. The pandemic was a hugely significant part of that, but since the start of the pandemic we have also faced other huge issues. Racism, climate change, women's rights, war and a cost of living crisis have all come to the fore too. As Christians we want to lead the way of renewal in these matters, and show people God's perfect ways for us to live.

## Pray, pray and pray

Prayer is always the most important thing that we can do in our lives, as we connect with our loving heavenly Father. We are also called to pray in the Bible for God's kingdom to come and his will to be done in this world. We can all pray on our own, in our families, in our home groups and at our church services. But, here are some more specific ways that we can join together in praying as God calls us to.

**Monday Zoom Prayers** - During the first lockdown we started a Monday morning Zoom prayer meeting, at 10:00. That has continued and is a great place for people to pray together at the start of the week.

**Prayer Triplets** - In the recent history of All Hallows a number of people were part of prayer triplets, where 3 people meet up regularly to pray together. We want to encourage us all to consider setting up such triplets with other people from church.

**Prayer Saturdays** - On Saturdays we take a half hour slot each, meaning that as a church we pray on a rota throughout the day.

**Thy Kingdom Come** - This is an international interdenominational initiative, where Christians pray for 5 people to come to faith in Jesus and that God's kingdom would come in this world.

**Text Prayer Chain** - We also have a prayer chain for those in need, where prayer requests can quickly be sent to those on the prayer chain, and they will pray for the person or situation mentioned.

**5** Alive - Choose 5 non-Christian people you know to pray for. Find out 5 things to pray for them, including that they would come to know Jesus (and consider whether you could be the answer to those prayers). Pray for those people 5 times a week. Invite them to one of the 5 invite events that will be

available at church. Keep going in praying for them and gently inviting them to events and activities.

### **First Time Here?**

If it's your first time here then welcome! It's great to have you with us. Here are a few short notes that you might find helpful.

**Relax** - You're our guest, so make yourself at home. If there is anything that you would like to know then ask a member of the Welcome Team.

Sign the kids in - The Welcome Team can show you where to take your children. Sometimes we are all in church together, but on other weeks... *Pre-School*; There are green tables in church with some activities for young children. Please, please don't be embarrassed if they make any noise during the service. *Ages 4*+; Sunday School meet in rooms at the end of the hall, down the ramp. *Sunday Youth* meet in the room off from the main worship area. All leaders have proper DBS checks.

Fill in a Communication Card - Drop it in the box on the Welcome Desk in the foyer or give it to the service leader on the way out. Please use it to ask questions, offer feedback or request prayer.

We don't expect guests to give - For those who are members or regular attenders of our churches there is an offering plate at the back, but we don't ask our guests for any money.

We have a Loop System - Switch your hearing aid to T-coil. You might find it useful to sit towards the middle.

Hang around afterwards - Come and join us for a cup of tea or fresh coffee, and for a chat.

**Prayer Ministry** - If you would like somebody to pray with you about something for yourself or somebody that you know then there are people who would love to do so after the service. Please make yourself known to the service leader.

#### DECLARE YOUR FAITH THROUGH BAPTISM


If you feel you've made a commitment to God but have never been baptised, then this could be a great step for you.
