Following Jesus

Later this month, we will be hosting a fantastic event called The Fisherman's Tale. Many of you will remember the Christmas Story Trail that we hosted a few years ago (and taking part in it). This is another story trail produced by the brilliant Bible Encounter Trust.

The Fisherman's Tale is aimed at primary aged children and we will have a number of school classes come through the building during those two weeks.

The focus of this trail is the life of Jesus through the eyes of one of his disciples, Peter. I haven't personally seen this trail yet and I'm very excited to do so.

That is partly because I love the story of Peter and his journey of faith with Jesus.

He was first introduced to Jesus by his brother Andrew. He saw Jesus heal his mother-in-law and

after all of this was called by lesus to follow him and to join in with the work and ministry of lesus. It is like it was baby steps for Peter, and then he just wanted to be around Jesus.

Yet it was only a couple of years later that he came to the point of being able to say to Jesus, "You are the Christ" (Mark 8:29), and even after that he denied knowing Jesus when Jesus had been arrested.

What a journey of faith for Peter. Introduced to lesus by somebody close to him, spending time getting to know him until he could see who Jesus really was, and then even after that he messed up big time with Jesus.

I think that one of the reasons I like the story of Peter is that it could very easily be me in that story. OK, I have never been a fisherman, but you get the point.

But, couldn't this story be the story of any of us? Introduced to Jesus / get to know him / still mess it up. So, where does that leave us when we mess it up?

Well, firstly, we should obviously do all that we can not to mess up in the first place. But, when we do we can be forgiven and still have a place in serving

Look at what Jesus said to Peter after the resurrection:

"Take care of my sheep (people)." (John 21:16)

"Follow me." (John 21:19)

It was a fresh start for Peter. He had messed up big time but he still belonged to Jesus and Jesus still had a job for him to do. He was not cast aside.

It is the same Jesus who we serve today. So when we mess up Jesus can restore us again to his service. That's such good news.

The Green Zone

This month's tip is to avoid saving data to 'the cloud' where you can. One of the biggest uses of power in the world is for the holding of data elsewhere. So, get rid of those unnecessary emails and pictures, and maybe even back up on your own portable hard drive.





One of the great charities that we support is Tearfund. Tearfund work in some of the most deprived parts of the world and also highlight how climate change so often affects those communities the most. On **Sunday 11**th **June** we will be spending time focussing on their great work during our morning service.

This is an advanced notice, but one worth mentioning now (and there will be more detail in the next newsletter). Our Thanksgiving Sunday this year is on **9**th **July**. Each year we have a capital project that we are raising money to pay for / pay towards. Last year was towards insulating the church hall better, which we have done. There was some money left over and so the PCC has agreed that the remaining money will go into a 'Thanksgiving Fund', which will help with making the buildings warmer. This year we are looking at ways to make the church building warmer.





Another advanced notice is that we will be holding an afternoon Cream Tea again this year. The date is set as Saturday, 15th July (although the exact time is yet to be set - see next month's newsletter for further details).

Last year we combined the Cream Teas with a Fun Day, but we are not doing that this year as it was extremely difficult to prepare so many in such a short space of time. So, this will be a quieter event (which we can still invite people along to.).

All Hallows Church is part of the Diocese of Chester. Over the past year or so the Bishop of Chester has been leading the Diocese through a period of vision and discernment, where people across the churches and communities can contribute to the overall vision. The hope and plan is that there will be a strategy in place and some specific steps for the Diocese and churches to take towards the end of the year.

New or Visiting?

First Time Here?

If it's your first time here then welcome! It's great to have you with us. Here are a few short notes that you might find helpful.

Relax - You're our guest, so make yourself at home. If there is anything that you would like to know then ask one of the Welcome Team by the front door.

We don't expect guests to give - For those who are members or regular attenders there is an offering plate at the back, but we don't ask our guests for any money.

We have a Loop System - Switch your hearing aid to T-coil. You might find it useful to sit towards the middle.

Hang around afterwards - Come and join us for a cup of tea or fresh coffee, and for a chat—drinks are served in the hall and we usually gather in the lounge to chat.

Prayer - If you would like someone to pray with you — either prayer for you or for someone you know — there are people who would love to do so after the service. Please make yourself known to the service leader.

Children & Youth - Once a month, the whole church worships together. On other weeks, there is a Sunday School for primary aged children and a group for high-school age young people. One of the Welcome Team can show you where these groups meet. For pre-school age children, there are green tables at the side of church with activities. Please don't be embarrassed if your children make any noise—they are welcome here and are part of the service, too! All our children and youth leaders have DBS checks and have undergone safeguarding training.

Next Steps
