The Cost

The cost of living crisis is really starting to bite for many people now. We have been seeing various food items and other products increase in price over the course of the past 6 months or so, there has been the gas price crisis throughout this past winter and now the horrendous war Ukraine is also causing further pressure on to food and energy prices alike.

We are hearing more and more tragic stories of people having to decide whether to pay for food or heating. Sadly, there have always been some families facing this grim reality, but now the sheer number of families falling into such need is catastrophic. Times are very tough for many people.

Even for many people not in such a dire position there are important decisions to be made about what things to cut down on and how to manage finances throughout this economic crisis, which we are told is likely to last for about a year.

How much do things cost and are they worth that cost at the moment? These are the kinds of questions that people are having to ask themselves.

I don't think that we can understate how serious a situation this is for many people and so we should be all the more kind and ready to find ways of supporting those in great need at this time.

As I think about these things and think about the message of Easter, which we will be celebrating this month, I'm also aware of the cost that Jesus took upon himself.

Ephesians 5:2 says, "Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."

Jesus knows what it is to be human and to pay a



cost. That does not in any way minimise the costs that those struggling financially today have to face.

But, the cost that Jesus faced and took upon himself was his own life. It was freely given so that those who turn to him do not need to pay any cost for their own sin. We do not need to earn forgiveness from God, because that forgiveness has been bought for us - at a The price was price. paid by Jesus, by his death on the cross.

But the great victory of our faith is that after the price was paid, God proved that it was paid in full when he raised Jesus from the dead. The great cost that brings us great freedom.

Easter Sunday - Before the morning service a special breakfast of croissants and pain au chocolat will be on offer for anybody who comes early enough. We will have our special Easter Sunday family service, which will be followed by Holy Communion for those who wish to stay behind for that and an Easter Egg Hunt for the children. The bouncy castle will also be up for further fun as we celebrate together after the service has finished. (There is an evening service on Easter Sunday as well, of course.)

First Time Here?

Relax - You're our guest, so make yourself at home. If there is anything that you would like to know then ask a member of the Welcome Team.

Sign the kids in - The Welcome Team can show you where to take your children. Sometimes we are all in church together, but on other weeks... *Pre-School*; There are green tables in church with some activities for young children. Please, please don't be embarrassed if they make any noise during the service. *Ages 4*+; Sunday School meet in rooms at the end of the hall, down the ramp. Sunday Youth meet in the room off from the main worship area. All leaders have proper DBS checks.

Fill in a Communication Card - Drop it in the box on the Welcome Desk in the foyer or give it to the service leader on the way out. Please use it to ask questions, offer feedback or request prayer.

We don't expect guests to give - For those who are members or regular attenders of our churches there is usually an offering, but we don't ask our guests for any money.

We have a Loop System - Switch your hearing aid to T-coil. You might find it useful to sit towards the middle.

Hang around afterwards - Come and join us for a cup of tea or fresh coffee, and for a chat.

Prayer Ministry - If you would like somebody to pray with you about something for yourself or somebody that you know then there are people who would love to do so after the service. Please make yourself known to the service leader.

If you're not in one, there are a number of groups that meet in homes throughout the week to get to know each other better, look at the Bible and pray together.


BE PART OF THE MISSION
