



Our World & Jesus

As I sit down to write this short article I do so in the opening days of 2026. It has already been a tumultuous year so far, and if the events of the first week or so are setting a precedent for the rest of the year then the mind boggles as to what other things might take place in the world.

The reality that we have seen over the past few years is that the world we knew is changing. Bigger, powerful countries are invading lesser powerful countries – and seem to be getting away with it. Money is tighter for so many people – and it might well get a lot worse. Our political systems don't seem to be working anymore – so, who will actually be able to represent us? Climate issues are affecting our weather patterns, water levels, ability to grow food, the air that we breathe and international migration – yet, climate deniers seem to be getting their way. AI is getting more powerful – and will likely take a lot of our jobs.

Added to that, people in the West are waking up to the lie that secularism has been pushing down our throats for decades – that you can be anything you want to be. It doesn't look like that, or feel like that, does it? And then there are the ordinary, everyday issues that people have to face too. Is it any wonder we've got such a huge mental health crisis going on at the moment?

So, where does Jesus fit into all of this, and how big is our view of God? For so many years there was this idea that was pushed and believed by many people in our churches that when we give our lives to Jesus everything will be OK. That God is on the side of his people and so bad things won't happen to us - unless we are disobedient to him. But these views were never correct; even though some people in the Church still believe them today.

We only have to think back to the days of Jesus and what the world was like at that time. He was a Jewish man living in Israel, which was under the rule of the emperor in Rome and his empire. Bad things happened to people. People generally didn't live as long because there wasn't anything like the level of health care that we have today. Jesus' own earthly father, Joseph, almost certainly died before Jesus started his ministry. There was poverty. There was fear. There were disagreements between people. The world was tumultuous.

So, it turns out that the gospel accounts of the ministry of Jesus and of the things he said and taught are incredibly relevant to a messy, unpredictable world. This winter we are looking at the story of Jesus from Mark's Gospel, and we will see how Jesus really does have so much to say into the world that we are living in today.

Rosemary is a local debt coach from All Hallows helping people here in Stockport out of financial difficulties. At Christians Against Poverty (CAP), we believe that tackling UK poverty should be on everybody's priority list. Here are six reasons why.

One in five of us lives in poverty

Millions of people across the UK currently live in poverty and it's on our doorstep here in Stockport. We may not always see it but there are families in our area who are struggling with spiralling debts and are unable to afford their basic needs. This is an issue that's much bigger, and much closer, than you might realise.

It impacts our local health services

The negative effect of severe financial difficulty on a person's physical and mental health directly impacts other public services, such as the NHS and mental health support. Many of those who seek debt help from CAP tell us their financial situation has affected their health in some way. For some, it worsened an existing condition, while it caused new health problems for others.

Millions are going without essentials

Every person should have access to the basic essentials they need to survive, such as food and a warm, safe home, but millions in the UK are skipping meals or going without heating and electricity. With positive actions we can help one household at a time out of debt and poverty and strengthen our communities.

Our future is at risk

Of the millions living in poverty in the UK, many are children. We know that financial difficulty affects all aspects of childhood, including schoolwork and friendships. With so many children at risk of falling behind in life, there will be an inevitable impact on the future of our society if we don't work together to tackle poverty and give kids the best opportunity to thrive and be successful in life.

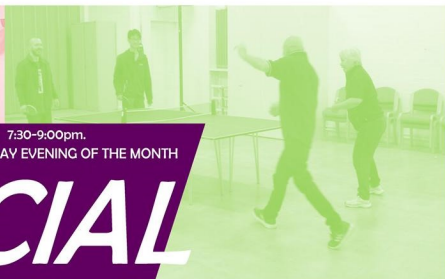

New or Visiting?

First Time Here?

If it's your first time here then welcome! It's great to have you with us. Here are a few short notes that you might find helpful.

Relax - You're our guest, so make yourself at home. If there is anything that you would like to know then ask one of the Welcome Team by the front door.

We don't expect guests to give - For those who are members or regular attenders there is an offering plate at the back, but we don't ask our guests for any money.

We have a Loop System - Switch your hearing aid to T-coil.

You might find it useful to sit towards the middle.

Hang around afterwards - Come and join us for a cup of tea or fresh coffee, and for a chat—drinks are served in the hall and we usually gather in the lounge to chat.

Prayer - If you would like someone to pray with you — either prayer for you or for someone you know — there are people who would love to do so after the service. Please make yourself known to the service leader.

Children & Youth - Once a month, the whole church worships together. On other weeks, there is a Sunday School for primary aged children. One of the Welcome Team can show you where Sunday School meets. For pre-school age children, there are green tables at the side of church with activities. Please don't be embarrassed if your children make any noise—they are welcome here and are part of the service, too! All our children and youth leaders have DBS checks and have undergone safeguarding training.

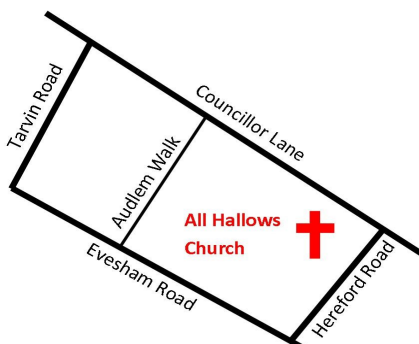
