5 Ways to Save on Your Food Shop

It's almost hard to believe how much all of our shopping bills have gone up in the last couple of years. As food prices remain high, now is a great time to look at ways to try and keep costs down where we can.

Create a food shop budget

With food costs constantly changing, it's easy to spend a lot more than you'd like on your weekly shop.

Set a budget limit and do your best to stick within it. Try cheaper alternatives to reduce your costs and avoid putting extra items into your shopping trolley just because they're on offer.

Be aware of yellow labels

Big yellow labels in supermarkets can make us think we're getting a real bargain, but are they really good deals or just colourful stickers to tempt us to buy stuff we don't really need?

Yellow label items can be a bargain, but sometimes you can still get the same product cheaper elsewhere or buy a different size of the same product for less. It's worth taking a minute or two to double check.

Check the cost per amount

Which sized product is the best to buy? If you look at the less obvious black and white labels, you'll often see a price per weight breakdown. This is super helpful to check as buying in bulk might mean you get more for your money.

Check the best before date

There's no point buying food that you won't have time to eat before it goes out of date. Check the best before dates, plan your meals in advance, and don't buy things that you regularly waste in order to save money and reduce food waste.

Try budget recipes

There are plenty of free resources online to help you learn new meals that you can cook on a budget. To find tasty budget recipes and sign up to a free local life skills course run by a church near you, visit <u>capuk.org/lifeskills</u> and take your money saving knowledge to the next level.

Jesus is my Captain, Brother, Rescuer & Friend

What do you think when you read this header "Jesus is my Captain, Brother, Rescuer and Friend"? Do you think, oh no military talk, that's not for me! I like the brother bit, I don't need a Rescuer because I am good, but I need a friend. So, we see the things we like and turn away or dismiss the thinks we don't like.

As a man in my 50s I have lived through the back end of the Cold War, Falklands War, Gulf War, Iraq War, War in Afghanistan, and the years of the IRA and now the Ukraine – Russian war that is going on right now. So, war is still around us and its scars can still be seen. And for a few people these scars are for life or have cost them their life.



Church Army founder Wilson Carlisle was a businessman that travelled round Europe

around the time of the Franco - Prussian war (1870 – 1871), and like a lot of people at that time lost most of his money due to the impact of war. This time was known as the Long Depression (1873-1896). Wilson whilst training to be a vicar in London saw the slums of Westminster and started to help the people of the slums with food and drink, reading and writing and training them to in turn go out and help. It was out of this work Church Army was set up in 1882. Or to put it another way, "An army of ordinary people", being trained to show and talk about the love of Jesus and recognise him as captain of our lives.

So going back to the heading "Jesus is my Captain, Brother, Rescuer and Friend", some may recognize this title as one of the CODEs from CVM (Christian Vision for Men) and you would be right. "Codelife" is a modern way of looking at the Beatitudes set out in Matthew chapter 5. The Code is set up by men for men.

With this in mind, I would like to invite you to a Men's Breakfast on Saturday 13th July starting at 9am, at the Micker Brook Pub, Cheadle, to share some food and conversation together with our fellow brothers from the local area, with a view to perhaps making it a regular event, looking at some of the CVM/Church Army material, to help us men in our faith journeys. It will cost around £7.

6 Principles of Prayer

Jesus' disciples were men and women of faith, and they knew how to pray. Yet on one occasion some of those inner disciples came to Jesus and asked him how they should pray, presumably because there was something about the way that Jesus prayed that they could see went deeper than their personal religious practices. Jesus taught them what we call 'The Lord's Prayer'. This is a structure for praying with 6 important principles contained within it:

- I. Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name Focus on our heavenly Father's character
- 2. Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven Focus on his kingdom and will
- 3. Give us today our daily bread Focus on his provision for our needs and the needs of others
- 4. Forgive us our debts, as we have also forgiven our debtors Focus on his forgiveness
- 5. And lead us not into temptation Focus on his guidance
- 6. But deliver us from evil Focus on his protection

As we pray through each of these different principles we remember more and more the goodness of God.



New or Visiting?

First Time Here?

If it's your first time here then welcome! It's great to have you with us. Here are a few short notes that you might find helpful.

Relax - You're our guest, so make yourself at home. If there is anything that you would like to know then ask one of the Welcome Team by the front door.

We don't expect guests to give - For those who are members or regular attenders there is an offering plate at the back, but we don't ask our guests for any money.

We have a Loop System - Switch your hearing aid to T-coil.

You might find it useful to sit towards the middle.

Hang around afterwards - Come and join us for a cup of tea or fresh coffee, and for a chat—drinks are served in the hall and we usually gather in the lounge to chat.

Prayer - If you would like someone to pray with you — either prayer for you or for someone you know — there are people who would love to do so after the service. Please make yourself known to the service leader.

Children & Youth - Once a month, the whole church worships together. On other weeks, there is a Sunday School for primary aged children and a group for high-school age young people. One of the Welcome Team can show you where these groups meet. For pre-school age children, there are green tables at the side of church with activities. Please don't be embarrassed if your children make any noise—they are welcome here and are part of the service, too! All our children and youth leaders have DBS checks and have undergone safeguarding training.
