There is a famous sermon segment from an American preacher in which he reminds the congregation that Sunday is a-coming.

Lines in that sermon include this: "It's Friday. The disciples are running like sheep without a shepherd, Mary's crying, Peter is denying. But they don't know that Sunday is a comin'."

And this: "It's Friday. The disciples are questioning what has happened to their King and the Pharisees are

celebrating that their scheming has been achieved. But they don't know, it's only Friday—Sunday's comin'."

The sermon continues with other great lines like this. The picture being of what it must have been like for the disciples at the time of Jesus, facing the greatest crisis of their lives. They had believed that Jesus was the Christ, they had believed that he was sent by God, they had given up their old lives to follow him and now he had been

crucified on the cross. The future of hope and joy that they thought was theirs is now in tatters. Their world has been utterly shaken to the core.

But, their perspective is only what they can see in the here and now. It is Friday and it is a terrible day.

What they don't know is that Sunday is coming. What they don't know is just how remarkable that day is going to be. And when it comes their lives really are going to be turned upside down,



but into a greater future of hope and joy than they could have ever imagined.

My friends, we are living through difficult days, but if the message of Easter reminds us of anything it is of the new life that God brings. It's Friday, but Sunday is a-coming.
