Foundations

When I was a young boy one of my favourite songs at Sunday School was called 'The Wise Man Built His House Upon The Rock'. It is based upon the last section of teaching that Jesus gives in, what today we call, The Sermon on the Mount. You can find it in Matthew 7:24-27.

The last verse of the song has the words, "So build your life on the Lord Jesus Christ." Now, that is a great sentiment but it is slightly out in terms of putting the Bible reading to song.

Jesus actually said this in verse 24, "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock."

If you don't know the story there is also a foolish man who built his house on sand, and he represents "everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice." A storm comes in Jesus' story and the wise man's house remains strong and upright whilst the foolish man's house crashes down.

It is all about the foundations and what the houses were built on. In life, Jesus says, the best foundations for us are to hear his words and to put them into

practice. In one sense we do build our lives on Jesus, but he is much more specific about what that should look like.

The teaching of Jesus shows us the standards that God has for us and where we all fall short of those standards. If we just look at The Sermon on the Mount then we see Jesus challenging the general views of his day about many things and giving us a wide range of teaching about many topics. Making our society a better place, anger, sexual ethics, divorce, keeping our word, not seeking revenge, loving our opponents, giving to



those in need, prayer and the list goes on.

The teaching of Jesus is wide and varied. Reading it and putting it into practice in our own lives gives us good and strong ethical foundations. Failing to read it or put it into practice gives us shaky and unstable foundations.

It is when life's storms come along (and we will all have them) that we get to see how good our life foundations are. Even though we might feel like we are taking a battering, will we be able to keep standing or will those life storms blow us over?

So let's stand strong in whatever storms come our way as we stand on the foundation that Jesus gives us.



We don't expect guests to give - For those who are members or regular attenders of our churches there is an offering plate at the back, but we don't ask our guests for any money.

We have a Loop System - Switch your hearing aid to T-coil. You might find it useful to sit towards the middle.

Hang around afterwards - Come and join us for a cup of tea or fresh coffee, and for a chat.

Prayer Ministry - If you would like somebody to pray with you about something for yourself or somebody that you know then there are people who would love to do so after the service. Please make yourself known to the service leader.

If you're not in one, there are a number of groups that meet in homes throughout the week to get to know each other better, look at the Bible and pray together.


BE PART OF THE MISSION
